Heartspring's Autism Services department is dedicated to helping children impacted by Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) learn, grow, and achieve independence through the Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) and Community of Autism Resources and Education (CARE) programs.

Applied Behavior Analysis

Heartspring's ABA services are evidence-based treatments for children impacted by autism designed to increase functional living skills and improve behaviors such as communication, social skills, and adaptive learning skills. Service structure varies by child and can include one-on-one therapy, parent training, office visits, home visits, and coordination of care with other facilities and therapies. Heartspring focuses on a comprehensive service model for children who are under the age of five through Early Intensive Behavioral Intervention (EIBI).

ABA Services Offers:

- An experienced and knowledgeable team for each child composed of a Board-Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA), Board-Certified Assistant Behavior Analyst (BCaBA) and/or Autism Specialist, Program Coordinator, and Registered Behavior Technicians (RBTs)
- In-depth assessment and evaluation of the child's needs
- Individualized programming to meet goals in the following areas:
 - Receptive Language
 - Expressive Language
 - Joint Attention and Imitation Skills
 - Social and Leisure Skills
 - Community and Group Readiness Skills
 - Concept Formation Skills
 - Reduction of Harmful Behaviors

 - Parent and Caregiver Training and Feedback

Social Skill Development

CARE Clubs

CARE Clubs offer a wide range of social skill-building opportunities. Our goal is to help children and teens with ASD learn valuable skills necessary for social and emotional development. Each club is tailored to fit the individual needs of the participants.

Camp SSTAR

Camp SSTAR is a fun, innovative eight-week summer program designed to help children and teens impacted by ASD or other developmental challenges develop social skills and continue growing during the summer months. Evidence suggests that children, especially those impacted by ASD, retain skills at a greater rate when structure, consistency, and skills are maintained outside of the school year.

Family Support Services

CARE's Family Support Services program gives families the tools they need to navigate an autism diagnosis. This program offers a monthly Parents' Night Out, Parent and Sibling Support Groups, Parent Information and Training, and a periodic Parents' Day Out. The CARE program also sponsors a parent site council comprised of families in various stages of the diagnosis to ensure successful program development.
